



54th CARIBBEAN AMATEUR GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS

Royal Westmoreland
Barbados
30th June – 3rd July, 2010

The 54th Caribbean Amateur Golf Championships, organised by the Caribbean Golf Association and hosted this year by the Barbados Golf Association, took place at Royal Westmoreland on 30th June – 3rd July, 2010. Teams from nine countries contested the Arthur Ziadie Trophy and 116 participants entered the five subsidiary team competitions. The weather was kind, with virtually no rain (only some welcome cooling showers) but strong winds, and the challenging course at Royal Westmoreland certainly tested the players. The Barbados team put home advantage to good use, lifting the Hoerman Cup for a second time. OECS won their first ever championship by lifting the Ramon Baez Trophy (for Mid-Amateurs) with Trevor Levine and Raymond Percival putting up a very strong performance. Trinidad & Tobago won the Francis and Steele Perkins Cup (for Seniors) and the Higgs & Higgs Trophy (for Super Seniors). Puerto Rico's Ladies team dominated the George Teale Trophy as well as picking up the Arthur Ziadie Trophy. Full results are on the following page.
